Subject: Robotics Engineering Class for Eighth and Ninth Grade Students

The Institute of MERIT is proud to offer our extended Robotics Engineering program for the fall of 2020. This course is aimed at students who are interested in designing, building and programming robots. It is only available to students who have successfully completed the ICPS program and who will be in grade 8 or 9 in September 2020. All students are expected to attend each of the 12 sessions.

This is a challenging and motivational learning experience driven by the students' own intelligence, invention, and inspiration. We are planning lots of fun filled activities that will develop critical thinking and team-building skills. Classes will combine applications in science, technology, engineering and mathematics, the basic STEM concepts.

This hands-on course will introduce students to computer programming and robotics. Students will be working in small groups with an open-source electronic prototyping platform called Arduino. This software allows each participant to write their own programs and then upload them to the electronics board. Participants will learn about sensors and actuators and understand differences between digital and analog signals. At the completion of the program students will be allowed to take home their SnappyXO robotic kits in order to continue their education.

The program will consist of 12 sessions, starting in September, and continuing through the end of December. No classes will be held on Thanksgiving weekend. Each session will take place on Saturday morning from 9 AM to 11:30 AM at SUNY College at Old Westbury.

The 12 Saturday dates for 2020-2021 will be the following:

I am very excited to be able to offer your child this wonderful opportunity at a tuition fee of \$350.
